




Program Options

COIL (Collaborative Online International Learning)

COIL course development can start in small ways, and does not require an institutional agreement to proceed. Typically, courses are developed through collaborations between faculty who know each other's work; however, some of the most innovative COIL courses involve connections between different disciplines. COIL courses do not need to by synchronous or encompass all elements of a course. You are therefore not limited by different time zones, academic calendars, or even your academic field.

You can connect with other CUNY educators with interest and/or experience in offering courses with COIL elements by joining the CUNY COIL Academic Commons group. This is the primary vehicle used to disseminate information about COIL opportunities at CUNY.

You can also request the COIL Course Guide from the SUNY COIL Center, which also facilitates an annual conference for faculty, instructional technologists, librarians and other educators that is held at a different U.S. campus each year.




